### **About**

**ojolo** is the artistic pseudonym of abel garcía jiménez, a mexican visual artist who navigates the borderlands between introspection, digital mythology, and symbolic perception. his work unfolds through a visual language that merges traditional craftsmanship with generative technologies, creating pieces that serve as mirrors, codes, and rituals of contemporary consciousness.

through series and drops, **ojolo** crafts narrative portals—windows into states of observation, emotional transformation, and poetic resistance. his art invites viewers to experience an aesthetic of awakening, silence, and heightened vision, reclaiming the act of seeing as a deeply political, mystical, and personal gesture.

ojolo isn't a character. he's a lens. a sign. a third eye drawn from pain and persistence.

**ojolo** (abel garcía jiménez) is a mexican visual artist and creative director based in mexico city. his work explores introspection, emotional memory, and daily delirium through digital media, painting, installation, and collage. with an aesthetic that fuses the brutal and the lyrical, he creates images that speak to viewers on a symbolic and sensory level.



### **Artist Statement**

ojolo's work begins with intuition and chaos—an emotional archaeology in constant tension between the inner self and the collective psyche. he works with fragments: dreamlike visuals, overloaded symbols, textures that scratch at memory. his visual universe explores the act of seeing with different eyes—internal, defiant, and unsettling. through digital tools, painting, and collage, he constructs visual spaces that invite viewers to lose and find themselves. rather than providing answers, he seeks resonance. each piece attempts to grasp what constantly slips away: the unnamable, the uncertain, the flame that burns without consuming. his language fuses the brutal with the poetic, mirroring the raw complexity of human emotion. in a world saturated with hollow images, ojolo aims to create presence. his work is an eye turned inward— ojolo is not an observer. he is the **wound that watches**.


### Plastic Series: visual constructs and visual counterpoints

**Visual constructs** is an ongoing series of paintings and digital compositions that explore the emotional tension between structure and presence. Using geometric forms—squares, rectangles, vertical lines—each piece constructs a non-representational architecture that feels simultaneously urban and psychological. These works are not blueprints of cities, but blueprints of the self.

Through strong contrasts, limited palettes, and spatial rhythm, the series reveals an invisible inner architecture: the systems we live in, the boxes we inhabit, the emotional codes embedded in structure. A recurring motif is the "watching presence"—a symbolic eye, a small witness—emerging from within the rigid framework. This figure interrupts the silence of the form and adds a layer of narrative tension.

**Visual constructs** merges visual minimalism with existential intimacy, echoing both Latin American concrete art and a post-digital sensitivity to control, repetition, and emotional subversion.


The recurring appearance of symbolic "eyes" embedded in the geometry introduces a subtle witness—an unsettling consciousness within the built form.

**Visual Counterpoints** is a series of paintings that explore the emotional tension between geometric order and intuitive disruption. Each composition is constructed through layered fields of color—often vibrant reds, muted grays, and dense blacks—interrupted by rigid shapes, vertical blocks, and sudden absences.

These elements create a spatial rhythm that evokes architecture, sound, and psychological weight.Rather than depicting physical spaces, the series maps internal structures: states of silence, pressure, fragmentation, and presence.

### Digital Series: macabre luddisms and mascarojos

Macabre Luddisms is a series of surreal character portraits that merge mechanical nostalgia with existential tension. Each figure—a one-eyed automaton, half circus performer, half puppet—emerges from a playful yet unsettling universe. With top hats, wheels, gears, and hollow gazes, these beings evoke a silent theatre of tragic humor. The series explores the line between whimsy and despair, where each character becomes a poetic metaphor for emotional survival. They embody the fragility of memory, the performative nature of identity, and the unsettling charm of malfunctioning innocence. Macabre Luddisms pays homage to vintage toys, early animation, and visual absurdism, while projecting a deeply personal mythology of the self as spectacle.

Mascarojo 37, digital artwork, 2025

The series fuses ancestral iconography with contemporary visual language. The eye becomes a wound, a scream, a portal—something too alert to ignore. In each piece, identity is not constructed but dismantled, leaving only presence: raw, staring, unresolved.

Mascarojos is a series of haunting portraits where faces are interrupted—erased, replaced, or overtaken—by a single, oversized symbolic eye. Each character wears a mask that doesn't hide, but rather magnifies their internal state. These beings are oracles, ghosts, and witnesses: part ritual, part rebellion. Rooted in Latin American expressionism and pre-Columbian echoes, as well as several ancient cultures
